Appointment of independent Member to the House of Lords Appointments Commission

Professor Adeeba Malik CBE DL has been appointed as an Independent Member of the House of Lords Appointments Commission (HOLAC).

Professor Adeeba Malik CBE DL has over 35 years' experience of working in the voluntary sector and has held several ministerial and non-ministerial appointments at local, regional and national level. She is currently the Deputy Chief Executive of QED Foundation, a charity dedicated to improving the economic and social circumstances of disadvantaged communities.

Adeeba was recently appointed as Lord Lieutenant of the County of West Yorkshire from December 2025. She is currently a member of the Strategic Race Advisory Board (Home Office), the State Honours Committee (Cabinet Office) and the UK-Pakistan Advisory Council (Foreign Office). She is also on the board of the Bradford Culture Company and is a Visiting Professor at York St John University.

Professor Malik's appointment follows an open competition under the Governance Code for Public Appointments. Her appointment is for a non-renewable term of five years and took effect from 1 September 2025.
